The Sacraments: Baptism Wylie United Methodist Church Pastor Jeff Hatcher – March 31, 2019

Matthew 3:11-17

II "I baptize you with water for repentance. But after me will come one who is more powerful than I, whose sandals I am not fit to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. 12 His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor, gathering his wheat into the barn and burning up the chaff with unquenchable fire." 13 Then Jesus came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptized by John. 14 But John tried to deter him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and do you come to me?" 15 Jesus replied, "Let it be so now; it is proper for us to do this to fulfill all righteousness." Then John consented. 16 As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lighting on him. 17 And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

Baptism is...

I. A <u>SIGN</u> OF GOD'S <u>COVENANT</u> WITH US

<u>Rom 4:11</u>

[Abraham] received the <u>sign of circumcision</u>, a seal of the <u>righteousness that he had by faith</u> while he was still uncircumcised. So then, <u>he is the father of all who believe</u> but have not been circumcised, <u>in order that righteousness might be credited</u> to them.

Matt 28:19

"Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, <u>baptizing them</u> in the name of <u>the Father</u> and of <u>the Son</u> and of <u>the Holy Spirit</u>."

2. ACKNOWLEDGED THROUGH <u>REPENTANCE</u> & <u>FAITH</u> IN JESUS CHRIST

Acts 2:36-39

36 "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Christ." 37 When the people heard this, they were cut to the heart and said to Peter and the other apostles, "Brothers, <u>what shall we do</u>?" 38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. 39 The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off — for all whom the Lord our God will call."

3. OFFERED TO <u>YOU</u> AND YOUR WHOLE <u>HOUSEHOLD</u>

Acts 16:28-33

28 But Paul shouted [to the jailer], "Don't harm yourself! We are all here!" 29 The jailer called for lights, rushed in and fell trembling before Paul and Silas. 30 He then brought them out and asked, "Sirs, <u>what must I do to be saved</u>?" 31 They replied, "<u>Believe in the Lord Jesus</u>, and you will be saved — you and your household." 32 Then they spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all the others in his house. 33 At that hour of the night the jailer took them and washed their wounds; then <u>immediately he and all his family were</u> <u>baptized</u>.

4. OUR RESPONSE TO THE <u>GOOD NEWS</u> OF JESUS CHRIST

Acts 8:26-38

29 The Spirit told Philip, "Go to that chariot and stay near it." 30 Then Philip ran up to the chariot and heard the [Ethiopian eunuch] reading Isaiah the prophet. "Do you understand what you are reading?" Philip asked. 31 "How can I," he said, "unless someone explains it to me?" So he invited Philip to come up and sit with him. 32 The eunuch was reading this passage of Scripture: "He was led like a sheep to the slaughter, and as a lamb before the shearer is silent, so he did not open his mouth. 33 In his humiliation he was deprived of justice. Who can speak of his descendants? For his life was taken from the earth." 34 The eunuch asked Philip, "Tell me, please, who is the prophet talking about, himself or someone else?" 35 Then Philip began with that very passage of Scripture and told him the good news about Jesus. 36 As they traveled along the road, they came to some water and the eunuch said, "Look, here is water. Why shouldn't I be baptized?" 38 And he gave orders to stop the chariot. Then both Philip and the eunuch went down into the water and Philip baptized him.
