10 I seek you with all my heart; do not let me stray from your commands. 11 I have hidden your word in my heart that I might not sin against you. 12 Praise be to you, O Lord; teach me your decrees.

To make a Godly decision, ask yourself...

I. WILL THE ACTION BE HELPFUL?

1 Corinthians 6:12

12 Everything is permissible for me-but not everything is beneficial. Everything is permissible for me-but I will not be mastered by anything.

- Will it make me a better person?
 - "not everything is beneficial"
- Does it tend to <u>control</u> me, or do I <u>control</u> it? "I will not be mastered by anything".

2. DOES THE ACTION BOTHER YOUR CONSCIENCE?

1 Peter 2:16

16 Live as free men, but <u>do not use your freedom as a cover-up</u> <u>for evil</u>; live as servants of God.

Genesis 3:9

9 But the Lord God called to [Adam], "Where are you?"

3. WILL THE ACTION HURT SOMEONE?

I Corinthians 8:9

9 <u>Be careful</u>, however, <u>that the exercise of your freedom does</u> not become a stumbling block to the weak.

To make a Godly decision, ask yourself...

4. IS IT A LOVING ACTION?

Galatians 5:13

13 You ... were called to be free. But do not use your freedom to indulge the sinful nature; rather, serve one another in love.

1 John 4:19

19 We love because he first loved us.

1 John 3:16

16 This is how we know what love is: <u>Jesus Christ laid down his</u> life for us. And we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers.
