Overcomer: Abraham (Overcoming Fear of the Unknown)

Genesis 12:1-5

I The Lord had said to Abram, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you. 2 "I will make you into a great nation and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing. 3 I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you." 4 So Abram left, as the Lord had told him; and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Haran.

1. MANY TIMES GOD ASKS US TO <u>FOLLOW</u> HIM INTO THE <u>UNKNOWN</u>

Genesis 12:1

I The Lord had said to Abram, "Leave your country, your people and your father's household and go to the land I will show you.

Matthew 4:19-20

19 "Come, follow me," Jesus said, "and I will make you fishers of men." 20 At once they left their nets and followed him.

Hebrews 11:1

I Now <u>faith</u> is being <u>sure of what we hope for</u> and <u>certain of</u> what we do not see.

2. THINGS USUALLY DON'T GO WELL WHEN WE RESPOND OUT OF FEAR

- Claimed Sarah was his sister twice out of fear (Gen 12 & 20)
- <u>Fathering Ishmael with Hagar</u> while not trusting God would allow Sarah to conceive (Gen 16)

3. GOD ALWAYS COMES THROUGH WHEN WE TRUST HIM AND RESPOND IN FAITH

Abraham trusted God would come through:

- He packed up and moved as the Lord had told him (age 75)
 Genesis 12:4
 So Abram left, as the Lord had told him...
- He trusted God would provide an heir (Abraham was 100, Sarah was 90)

Genesis 17:19

19 Then God said, "... your wife Sarah will bear you a son, and you will call him Isaac. I will establish my covenant with him as an everlasting covenant for his descendants after him.

- He trusted God when told to sacrifice Isaac Genesis 22:2-3

2 Then God said (to Abraham), "Take your son, your only son, Isaac, whom you love, and go to the region of Moriah. Sacrifice him there as a burnt offering on one of the mountains I will tell you about." 3 Early the next morning Abraham got up and saddled his donkey. He took with him two of his servants and his son Isaac.
