Overcomer: Daniel, and Friends (Overcoming the Trap of Peer Pressure) Wylie United Methodist Church Pastor Jeff Hatcher - July 18, 2021

Daniel 6:16-24

16 So the king gave the order, and they brought Daniel and threw him into the lions' den. The king said to Daniel, "May your God, whom you serve continually, rescue you!" 17 A stone was brought and placed over the mouth of the den, and the king sealed it with his own signet ring and with the rings of his nobles, so that Daniel's situation might not be changed. 18 Then the king returned to his palace and spent the night without eating and without any entertainment being brought to him. And he could not sleep. 19 At the first light of dawn, the king got up and hurried to the lions' den. 20 When he came near the den, he called to Daniel in an anguished voice, "Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you serve continually, been able to rescue you from the lions?" 21 Daniel answered, "O king, live forever! 22 My God sent his angel, and he shut the mouths of the lions. They have not hurt me, because I was found innocent in his sight. Nor have I ever done any wrong before you, O king." 23 The king was overjoyed and gave orders to lift Daniel out of the den. And when Daniel was lifted from the den, no wound was found on him, because he had trusted in his God. 24 At the king's command, the men who had falsely accused Daniel were brought in and thrown into the lions' den, along with their wives and children. And before they reached the floor of the den, the lions overpowered them and crushed all their bones.

To overcome the trap of peer pressure, we must...

1. RECOGNIZE OUR IDENTITY

Daniel 6:20

20 When [king Darius] came near the den, he called to Daniel in an anguished voice, "Daniel, servant of the living God, <u>has your God</u>, whom you serve continually, been able to rescue you <u>from the lions?"</u> 21 Daniel answered, "O king, live forever! 22 My God sent his angel, and he shut the mouths of the lions. They have not hurt me, because I was found innocent in his sight.

Galatians 2:20

20 <u>I have been crucified with Christ</u> and <u>I no longer live</u>, but <u>Christ lives in me</u>. The life I live in the body, <u>I live by faith in the Son of God</u>, who loved me and gave himself for me.

To overcome the trap of peer pressure, we must...

2. REALIZE THAT OUR <u>STRENGTH</u> TO STAND FIRM COMES FROM GOD

Daniel 3:16

16 Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego replied to the king, "O Nebuchadnezzar, we do not need to defend ourselves before you in this matter. 17 If we are thrown into the blazing furnace, the God we serve is able to save us from it, and he will rescue us from your hand, O king. 18 But even if he does not, we want you to know, O king, that we will not serve your gods or worship the image of gold you have set up."

To overcome the trap of peer pressure, we must...

3. REMEMBER THAT OUR <u>FAITHFULNESS</u> BRINGS <u>GLORY</u> TO GOD AND CAN <u>IMPACT</u> PEOPLE

Daniel3:28

28 Then Nebuchadnezzar said, "Praise be to the God of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego, who has sent his angel and rescued his servants! They trusted in him and defied the king's command and were willing to give up their lives rather than serve or worship any god except their own God.
