Genesis 1:26a, 27-28a, 31

26 Then God said, "Let us make man <u>in our image</u>, <u>in our</u> <u>likeness</u>..." 27 So <u>God created man in his own image</u>, <u>in the image of</u> <u>God he created him</u>; male and female he created them. 28 <u>God</u> <u>blessed them</u> and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it... " 29-30... 31 <u>God saw all that he had</u> <u>made</u>, and <u>it was very good</u>. And there was evening, and there was morning — the sixth day.

Genesis 2:7, 18, 21-24

7 <u>the Lord God formed the man</u> from the dust of the ground and <u>breathed into his nostrils the breath of life</u>, and the <u>man became a</u> <u>living being</u>. 8-17... 18 The Lord God said, "It is not good for the <u>man to be alone</u>. I will make a helper suitable for him." 19-20... 21 So the Lord God caused the man to fall into a deep sleep; and while he was sleeping, he took one of the man's ribs and closed up the place with flesh. 22 Then <u>the Lord God made a woman</u> from the rib he had taken out of the man, and he brought her to the man. 23 The man said, "This is now <u>bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh</u>; she shall be called 'woman,' for she was taken out of man." 24 For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and <u>they will become one flesh</u>.
