A House Divided: Will Fail

Acts 5:25-42

25 Then someone came and said, "Look! The men you put in jail are standing in the temple courts teaching the people." 26 At that, the captain went with his officers and brought the apostles. They did not use force, because they feared that the people would stone them. 27 Having brought the apostles, they made them appear before the Sanhedrin to be questioned by the high priest. 28 "We gave you strict orders not to teach in this name," he said. "Yet you have filled Jerusalem with your teaching and are determined to make us guilty of this man's blood." 29 Peter and the other apostles replied: "We must obey God rather than men! 30 The God of our fathers raised Jesus from the dead — whom you had killed by hanging him on a tree. 31 God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and forgiveness of sins to Israel. 32 We are witnesses of these things, and so is the Holy Spirit, whom God has given to those who obey him." 33 When they heard this, they were furious and wanted to put them to death. 34 But a Pharisee named Gamaliel, a teacher of the law, who was honored by all the people, (also taught Saul - Acts 22) stood up in the Sanhedrin and ordered that the men be put outside for a little while. 35 Then he addressed them: "Men of Israel, consider carefully what you intend to do to these men. 36 Some time ago Theudas appeared, claiming to be somebody, and about four hundred men rallied to him. He was killed, all his followers were dispersed, and it all came to nothing. 37 After him, Judas the Galilean appeared in the days of the census and led a band of people in revolt. He too was killed, and all his followers were scattered. 38 Therefore, in the present case I advise you: Leave these men alone! Let them go! For if their purpose or activity is of human origin, it will fail. 39 But if it is from God, you will not be able to stop these men; you will only find yourselves fighting against God." 40 His speech persuaded them. They called the apostles in and had them flogged. 1. IF OUR PURPOSE IS <u>NOT</u> OF GOD, IT WILL COME TO NOTHING

Acts 5:35-37

35 Then [Gamaliel] addressed them: "Men of Israel, consider carefully what you intend to do to these men. 36 Some time ago <u>Theudas</u> appeared, <u>claiming to be somebody</u>, and about four hundred men rallied to him. <u>He was killed</u>, all <u>his followers were dispersed</u>, and <u>it all came to nothing</u>. 37 After him, <u>Judas the Galilean appeared</u> in the days of the census and led a band of people in revolt. <u>He too was killed</u>, and <u>all his followers were scattered</u>.

2. IF OUR PURPOSE IS FROM GOD, <u>NOTHING</u> CAN <u>STOP</u> US

Acts 5:38-39

38 Therefore, in the present case I advise you: Leave these men alone! Let them go! For if their purpose or activity is of human origin, it will fail. 39 But if it is from God, you will not be able to stop these men; you will only find yourselves fighting against God."

3. WE SHOULD EXPECT <u>OPPOSITION</u> IF WE FOLLOW GOD

Acts 5:17, 33, 40

17 ... the Sadducees, were <u>filled with jealousy</u>. 18 They arrested the apostles and put them in the public jail. 33 ... <u>they were furious</u> and <u>wanted to put them to death</u>. 40 [Gamaliel's] speech persuaded them. They called the apostles in and <u>had them flogged</u>. Then <u>they ordered</u> them not to speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.

4. WE SHOULD <u>REJOICE</u> IN <u>SUFFERING</u> FOR CHRIST'S SAKE & NEVER STOP <u>PROCLAIMING</u> THE GOOD NEWS OF JESUS

Acts 5:41-42

41 The apostles left the Sanhedrin, rejoicing because they had been counted worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name. 42 Day after day, in the temple courts and from house to house, they never stopped teaching and proclaiming the good news that Jesus is the Christ.
